GHANA New developments

Motorbikes! Traffic! The roads! The cell phones! You immediately notice the increase. Women with babies on their backs and phone calls on top of their curly heads speed past you on the motorbike. Entire families are transported with it and the last means of transport that the Japanese have introduced is a motorcycle with a cargo box. This motor replaces the donkeys, which used to provide this form of transport. Unfortunately, quite a few accidents happen with this means of transport, but also because of the large number of motorcycles. I was told that on average there is one fatal accident per week.

In terms of infrastructure, a lot of progress has been made, especially in the area of communication. Everyone seems to have a cell phone and that in all walks of life. The wired telephone, I think, is hardly used anymore and for many the era of it is simply skipped. The Chinese are building broad roads, but traffic is increasing to such an extent that cities such as Accra and Kumasi are severely congested!

Ghana was the only African country to experience economic growth of more than 12% in 2011. But who will benefit the most?! Everywhere I saw women walking with large buckets of water on their heads. And not only in the remote villages, but also in Accra and other large cities. I sometimes thought: When will the time come when everyone in Ghana will have running water at home?

- * The prevention team's request for safe transport over the dirt roads was granted thanks to a generous legacy of 100k of a former tropical doctor.

The vehicles are blessed by the bishop: many safe kilometers and take good care of the vehicles! Many lives are saved thanks to safe cars.

- * The next step is the housing of the new generator. Funded by the same generous legacy.
